As a result of the pandemic, project visits were not frequent and fairly low, after the lockdown. We had to resume our visits from August but as the danger still lingered, there were certain restrictions. All the projects visits are accounted here.

In 2021, we rescued 15 more girls and currently we are sheltering 150 girls approximately. We are trying our best to provide them with all the necessities, especially their medical needs and treatments; psychological healing therapy is also provided through dance, music and art. The second wave had wreaked havoc on everybody and the impact still remains. As due to the second wave, entry or access was strictly prohibited at our Narendrapur home, there were no such activities or visits possible for few months. However, on 15th August, we celebrated the Independence Day with the children at our Home. An event was organized on the occasion of the Independence Day. The children presented various performances of dance, recitation, and singing. We participated and performed as well. A drawing competition was also held and prizes were distributed accordingly. The sheer joy and happiness radiating from their faces, made the day. It was a remarkable day for everyone and we hope to continue making their conditions and lives better.

PROJECT VISITS

On 1st of November, 2021, Supporters Tuhin Kumar Saha and his uncle SS Majumdar, came to celebrate Mr. Tuhin Saha's Birthday with the children of Behala Orphanage. After Cake cutting ceremony, cakes, chocolates, food and stationery were distributed amongst the children. They loved interacting and spending time with the children.

The Sason orphanage home is currently housing 40 boys approx. They are provided with food, clothing, other basic and medical necessities and also educational facilities. At present, the Behala orphanage home shelters around 50 boys where we provide the basic amenities along with all the other needs, and full formal schooling or education. On 5th of September, on the occasion of Teachers' day, Dr. Tinku Sinha, from SINP, visited our Behala Orphanage home. The time she spent there, was wholesome for the children and also insightful. She enjoyed and loved interacting with the children and answering their curiosity. We strive to give them a life that they deserve and did not get the chance to live at first. Their well being and all the other necessities are looked after. Although this pandemic has been rough enough, they still continue to move forward. We hope to give them the love and care and make their future better.

They were ecstatic and it was an immensely beautiful experience. They thoroughly enjoyed themselves and we loved watching them happy.

Prof. Tanuka Chattopadhyay of Rajabajar Science College visited our Narendrapur Home for Trafficked girl children on 10th of December, 2021. She had had a great time with the girls and she presented them with all the books of their choice. The children were overjoyed on receiving the desired presents.

One of our supporters portrayed and highlighted about the issue of Trafficking and how the work we are trying to do, helps and impacts the lives of these trafficked victims. We launched our online shopping stop 'SAMVARTANA', in December, which has been a major step towards the self-sustaining future of the beneficiaries and the organisation as a whole.



At our Behala Orphanage, Karate classes have begun and the children are quite energetic and enthusiastic to learn and practice this martial art. Also, in March, Manikuntala Ma'am, arranged for a table tennis board so that the children there could play table-tennis and they were quite hyped about it.

From the Baruipur Home for special children, some young boys have been sent to get trained for the upcoming Olympiad.

Also, 17 children from there, go to a Special School Named REACH (Rehabilitation Education Assessment of Children Handicapped).

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

We provide different vocational training to the trafficked victims and underprivileged women in our society so that they can be independent and self-reliant and get back to the mainstream society. Women need to be, and feel independent to combat the patriarchal and chauvinistic society. Self-development programs help them enlighten their lives, make them self-reliant and empowered and these include cutting and sewing, embroidery on saree and blouse pieces, block-printing and various other handicrafts.

Vocational training is also provided to special children. They are taught to create various handmade decorative items from recyclable items- rice sacks become ropes and floor mats, straws and sticks are transformed into rickshaw pen-stand, Newspaper crafted into Paper roses and wind-chimes, etc.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion and report as under:


